APPLIED TELEVISION I

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

MC165. Applied Television I. 1 hour credit. No Prerequisite: Designed for students actively participate in television production. The student will be involved in actual television production, resulting in the regularly broadcast (on cable) student-managed television program.
