

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS REGARDING THE H<sub>1</sub>N<sub>1</sub> (SWINE FLU) VIRUS AND ITS IMPACT AT BUTLER



## HAVE THERE BEEN ANY CASES OF HINI (SWINE) VIRUS AT BUTLER?

Yes there have been confirmed cases of the H<sub>1</sub>N<sub>1</sub> virus at the Butler campuses. The college is in regular contact with local public health officials with weekly updates.

## ARE ANY CLASSES OR CAMPUS ACTIVITIES BEING CANCELED?

At this time, all activities at BUTLER are operating normally, although everyone is advised to be extra careful about personal hygiene, including frequent hand washing. The college is monitoring the situation closely and will adjust plans if future conditions warrant. The college's response to the outbreak will be based on recommendations from federal, state and county public health authorities.

## WHAT IS THE COLLEGE DOING TO MONITOR THE SITUATION?

The college is in regular contact with local public health officials, in accordance with its preplanned response protocol. Meetings with relevant administrative staff are occurring as needed.

## WHAT ARE FLU-LIKE SYMPTOMS?

Symptoms come on suddenly (within hours) and include fever over 100.0 F (some only have chills and no fever), sore throat, cough, body aches, head aches, dizziness, and possibly nausea and vomiting.

## SHOULD I REPORT TO CLASS OR WORK IF I HAVE FLU-LIKE SYMPTOMS?

No. Individuals experiencing flu-like symptoms are advised to stay home and rest so they don't spread illness.

## HOW CAN I PREVENT THE FLU FROM SPREADING?

Good hand-washing, hand sanitizers, staying at least 6 feet from people who are coughing and sneezing and maintaining a healthy lifestyle with a balanced diet and plenty of rest and exercise. If you are ill, students, faculty, and staff should stay home until fever free (<100.0 F) for 24 hours without medication. Visit <http://www.cdc.gov/flu/protect/habits.htm> for more information.

Students experiencing flu-like symptoms are advised to call College Health Service's Nurse at 316-322-3371 or 316-218-6282 for advice or to determine if a clinic visit is necessary. Staff or faculty that are experiencing flu-like symptoms are advised to contact their personal physician.

## WHERE SHOULD STUDENTS, STAFF AND FACULTY LOOK FOR UPDATED INFORMATION REGARDING THE HINI OUTBREAK?

## SHOULD I RECEIVE A FLU SHOT THIS YEAR?

**YES!!** The regular seasonal influenza vaccine should be available through College Health Service by Nov. 1, 2009. We may also be receiving H<sub>1</sub>N<sub>1</sub> vaccine from KDHE for High risk groups (Pregnant women and college age students are high risk). Check pipeline frequently for updates.
