#### **STANDING REPORTS**

<u>Student Government Association</u> – New SGA President Christian Leis told the board they had done a few activities to welcome students back to campus including passing out candy and fun at the volleyball pit. Operational Staff – Katie Zarchan reported that they have given out three of their OpStaff book scholarships this year to Lisa Bolin, Maritza Marquez-Mazariego and Katrina Schneweis. They are also ramping up for their fundraisers for the year to support the book scholarship and other events through OpStaff. They are hosting the Holiday Sale again and invite staff and close friends of the college to sell their handmade items at the sale which will take place October 29 & 30.

<u>Professional Employees</u> – Terry Sader introduced Kris Estes to the board. Kris is the new vice-president and has served as a faculty member at Butler for 12 years. Kris invited the Board to the Veterans Day celebration in November which will be held at Butler of Andover.

Terry also shared that the Association awarded their first scholarship recipient this semester – Alyssa Jolly. The scholarship is for students with an interest in education. The members of the committee include Susan Forrest, Apryl Nenortas, Jon Simpson, Grayson Barnes, and Keith West.

Board Finance Committee – Trustee Engelbrecht said that everyone could find the monthly expenses and revenue report on page 128 of the board book. Revenues for this month are a little ahead of where we've been in the past mostly due to the tuition increase as well as the reclassification of fees as revenue. He also said that Kent Williams is hopeful the Finance division will be able to give the board an update in early fall rather than at the end of the semester.

<u>Foundation Board Report</u> – Eileen said that the Foundation Board met last month and they are excited to be hosting the author of <u>The Glass Castle</u>, Jeanette Walls, for the Harold Smith Cultural Series on October 22<sup>nd</sup>. The event is free and open to the public.

The Foundation is also processing emergency loans for students daily as they wait for their federal financial aid to come in. Dr. Krull shared that the Foundation is giving out almost \$1 million in scholarships this semester.

Two new board members were also introduced at the meeting – Ryan Murry and Janice Jones.

<u>President's Report</u> – Dr. Krull reported that the benefits enrollment for faculty and staff is complete. With this being the first year that it was done entirely electronically, it went very smooth. She wanted to make sure the human resources staff received proper kudos for all of their hard work to make that happen.

KACCT is this weekend, September 14 and 15, in Highland. They will have a legislative updated with Aly Devine as well as a discussion on how better engage legislators.

Butler is hosting KCCLI (Kansas Community College Leadership Institute) this Thursday and Friday (September 13 & 14). We will host 29 representatives from community colleges across the state. Heather Ward, Director of Financial Aid, and Mel Whiteside, Dean of the STEM division, are the two representatives from Butler attending this year's Institute.

Enrollment goals have been set for the 20<sup>th</sup> day. We were down from our 1<sup>st</sup> day goals, but ahead of the 20<sup>th</sup> day goals. Final numbers will be available next Tuesday.

<u>Education Facilities Authority Report</u> – There was not a report from the committee though Dr. Krull did say that the administration is looking at having meetings more regularly than quarterly because there is too big of a gap between meetings right now. The meetings would take place with greater frequency during sports seasons.

# **BOARD STRATEGIC DISCUSSION – ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITES**

<u>Future Vision for he Agriculture Program</u> – Joe Leibbrandt and Derek Foust shared information on where they see the future of the Agriculture Program at Butler. The faculty in the Agriculture Program include Joe who is beginning his fourth year at Butler, Taylor Frank who is in his second year, and Derek who is a first year instructor. They have several partnerships with local organizations including Butler County Farm Bureau, K-State Extension Offices and 4H clubs, and Bluestem and Flint Hills school districts. They would love to extend their animal collection to include goats and hogs. They are currently researching grants to help fund future events.

Derek shared that he would love to have a greenhouse on campus in the distant future, but would really love to get a hoop-house up soon. He is also eager to work with other programs at Butler including the Culinary Arts program and the Drone program to see what great partnerships can be formed.

<u>Faculty Development Team</u> – Mark Jarvis, Director of Faculty Development, shared an update on what his team has done since they last presented to the Board in February. They have completed another Summer Jam, hosted PDD, and several Second Saturdays increasing their total number of professional development hours to over 20,000.

<u>Compensation Increases for Staff and Part-Time Faculty</u> – Kent Williams recommended that the Board use the following information for compensation of Operational Staff, Institutional Support Staff, Coaches, and Administrative Staff:

# Recommendation for staff salary increase:

The administration recommends a **2.0% salary increase** for each full-time and part-time staff member: Operational Staff, Institutional Support Staff, Coaches, and Administrative Staff, except for the President whose contract is considered separately.

## Recommendation for part-time faculty:

The administration recommends an increase in the salary rate for part-time faculty of per credit hour from \$636 to \$649. This is a **2.0% increase** rounded to the nearest dollar.

Recommendation for staff health insurance contribution increase:

The administration recommends that the college contributions to staff health insurance premiums remain the same.
